

Round Leaved Sundew
Flytrap used to treat coughs and bronchial asthma. In the 17th century the leaves were boiled in asses milk to treat whooping cough.
The acidic properties of the plant were used by ladies mixed with milk to remove freckles and sunburn.



Sphagnum Moss
Plant used in the Bronze
age to treat the healing of
wounds. The antibiotic
penicillin and absorbent
properties were used until
the second world war to
prepare effective wound
dressings. Also used as
alternative to toilet paper
and nappies.

Heather Cander Moss Flowers are used for antiseptics and sedatives and in the treatment of urinary infections. Heather extract is also used in treating rheumatism and eczema. The flowers are used to produce honey or dried to make tea. The shoots of the plant are used to produce Heather Ale Fraoch which has been brewed in Scotland for over 4000 years. Also used to make rope.
